CARING FOR YOUR NEWLY SEEDED OR RENOVATED LAWN

WATERING— Keep evenly moist, not soggy. Do not allow to dry out.

Water gently: by hand is best; sprinklers o.k.

Water for a few minutes 1 - 4 times per day: once if cool and cloudy;

two to three times if warm and sunny; three to four times if hot or windy.

Continue until fully germinated--about three weeks.

Taper off gradually to one inch 2 - 3 times a week.

Stop watering if raining.

GERMINATION--...your lawn is a mixture of grass types.

Rye/bluegrass/red fescue blends germinate in 1 - 2 weeks; different types sprout unevenly at first.

Blends of tall or dwarf fescues may take up to 3 weeks.

Germination is slower in cold weather.

TRAFFIC-- NO traffic during germination.

In an emergency step on boards laid on the grass.

Normal light traffic after 3 - 4 mowings.

MOWING-- Sharpen your mower before you cut tender new grass.

Mow first after 4 - 6 weeks, when 3 - 4 inches tall.

Cut to two inches. **WEEDS--** Weed seeds are everywhere.

Some will sprout. Many annual weeds will be killed by mowing.

Some weeds may need chemical treatment.

FERTILIZER-- Starter fertilizer was probably applied at the time of planting.

Fertilize again in 2 - 3 months.

Feed regularly March, May, Sept., Nov., and Jan.

Ask us $\underline{\text{before}}$ applying fertilizers with pre-emergents to kill weed seeds or weed-killers to kill existing weeds.

PROBLEMS-- Wind: check watering 3 - 4 times/day when windy.

Fungus can kill newly sprouted grass

Damage from kids and pets usually can be repaired if done quickly.

Insects can eat new sprouts rapidly

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
